





About the Program





What is the Young Ambassadors Program?

The Young Ambassadors Program (YAP) is a nationally recognized program for graduating high school seniors that fosters the next generation of community-conscious leaders in the arts, sciences, and humanities via the Smithsonian Institution and its resources.





Summer Program Overview

- Participate in a **weeklong pre-professional seminar** with precollegiate peers from all over the nation **in Washington, D.C.**, at the Smithsonian.
- Complete a four-week community practicum at a museum or other cultural center in one of 19 cities across the United States and Puerto Rico.
- Explore careers in the arts, sciences and humanities and meet professionals in various disciplines.
- Enhance networking skills and knowledge.





Expenses and Program Stipend

- Participation in YAP includes meals and accommodations for the duration of the one-week seminar and round-trip travel costs to Washington.
- Students selected are responsible for all expenses during the fourweek community practicum experience, including transportation, accommodations, and meals.
 - The museum encourages applicants to select sites in their local regions or in regions where applicants may be able to stay with family or friends in the area.
- Upon completion of the five-week program, participants will receive a \$2,350 program stipend.
- Students that do not complete the training seminar and four-week community practicum will not receive the program stipend.





Eligibility

Up to 24 participants are selected through a competitive process, guided by a selection committee.

To be eligible for the program, you must:

- Be a high school senior graduating in 2025;
- Be authorized to work in the United States;
- Have a minimum weighted cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.25 on a 4.0 scale;
- Be fluent in English;
- Be enrolled full-time in a degree-seeking program at an accredited college of university (2- or 4-year institution) (enrollment will be verified for Fall 2025);
- Commit to participate in the one-week training seminar at the Smithsonian Institution and complete a four-week paid community practicum experience.

YAP is equally open to students of all races and ethnicities, without preference or restriction based on race or ethnicity. The Museum does not use racial or ethnic classifications or preferences in selecting awardees for YAP. Applicants need not identify as Latino or Hispanic to apply.





Evaluation Criteria

The selection committee is comprised of museum and education professionals. They evaluate all application materials and submissions based on the following criteria, equally weighted on a 5-point scale:

- Excellence in the:
 - Arts (e.g., film, visual, performing, design);
 - Sciences (e.g., natural, biological, chemical, planetary);
 - Humanities (e.g., language, literature, social sciences, business).
- Academic record
- Leadership experience
- Commitment to education
- Service learning and engagement with the Latino community



How to Apply







Accessing the Application

- Create a Smithsonian Online Academic Appointment System (SOLAA) account by following this link https://solaa.si.edu.
- Register a username and password; please be sure to save this information.
- Once registered in SOLAA, search for the National Museum of the American Latino 2025 Young Ambassadors Program.
- Complete and submit your application for the 2025 YAP with all its materials. These application materials include your three short statements, one resume, one video, one picture, and one letter of recommendation.
 - Please upload your statements and resume as PDF files, if possible. If submitting Microsoft Word documents, ensure they are .doc files NOT .docx. Please ask your recommenders to do the same.
 - Photos can be uploaded as .jpg or .pdf.
 - Follow the instructions for video upload on the application.





Accessing the Application

Please note: The application does not recognize special characters or accent marks. Please do not use when filling out the application.

Application Contents

A complete Young Ambassadors Program online application (via SOLAA) includes:

- Three short statements (up to 350 words each)
- One short video (2 minutes or less)
- One photo for Program Participant Booklet
- One Resume
- One (1) letter of recommendation that has been completed by an instructor, mentor or advisor





Letters of Recommendation and Additional Materials

The letter of recommendation must be submitted by the recommender directly to the National Museum of the American Latino via the SOLAA system or by email to MMALYAP@si.edu. The letter should address the applicant's academic (discipline) excellence, leadership qualities, intellectual curiosity, community service, and goal setting abilities.
